

Inspire adviser volunteer role description

An Inspire country and region coordinator supports Girlguiding volunteers to shape Girlguiding Inspire for young adult members. You'll work with county coordinators to help make sure there's on-theground support to empower young women aged between 18 and 30 as Girlguiding Inspire grows.

Why we love this role:

As a country and region coordinator you'll help empower members aged 18-30 to be part of Girlguiding Inspire. Working with Girlguiding volunteers and your country or region, you'll shape and develop Girlguiding Inspire for young adult members. And alongside your county teams you'll make sure there's on-the-ground support for young women through county coordinators. Girlguiding Inspire is a part of Girlguiding's Strategy which has three themes.

These are: creating exceptional experiences for girls, developing a rewarding volunteer experience and being inclusive and impactful. Girlguiding Inspire is designed to help as many young women as possible develop into empowered, independent women through a supportive and fun community. It lets members choose their own journey, based around seven pathways and two themes.


These are:

- **Beyond the UK**
- Events experience Sharing skills Leading the way

- Developing others
- Voice and action
- Learning and awards
- Just for me

As an Inspire country and region coordinator you'll be supporting the aims and objectives of Girlguiding and be passionate about the aims of Girlguiding Inspire and its opportunities. You'll work with different counties to make sure members are supported to take part in opportunities and events and help set up social groups with their peers.

Whether they're doing their Duke of Edinburgh award, being a unit leader, volunteering at a Girlguiding festival, going away with GOLD or using their voice to campaign for change in their community, we want to make sure our members are supported, connected and empowered.





Some of what you'll do:

An Inspire country and region coordinator supports Girlguiding volunteers to shape Girlguiding Inspire for young adult members. You'll work with county coordinators to help make sure there's on-the-ground support to empower young women aged between 18 and 30 as Girlguiding Inspire grows.

- Keep on track. Make sure that the work and plans of Girlguiding Inspire for the country/region are in line with the country/region strategy or business plan.
- Be a champion. Build and maintain strong relationships with senior and lead volunteers and staff in the country or region, acting as a champion for Girlguiding Inspire.
- Keep the team in the loop. Update the country or region team on Girlguiding Inspire activity and how it's meeting country/region aims.
- Use social media. Run and update social media groups (such as Facebook and Instagram) in line with the country/region social media.
- Help plan and run things. Fulfil country/region plans where appropriate, and help plan events for Girlguiding Inspire in the country and region, including residential events with the support of other members.
- Build a network. Work with county teams to build and support a network of county coordinators who
 will empower Girlguiding Inspire members to use local opportunities.
- Tell members about Girlguiding Inspire. Use effective communication such as social media to talk about Girlguiding Inspire and its opportunities and encourage participation.
- Find out what is needed. Consult with young women in the country or region and gather their feedback, so that Girlguiding Inspire and its opportunities reflect their views and interests.
- Help develop Girlguiding Inspire. Actively identify and develop opportunities for Girlguiding Inspire and share ideas with other countries and regions and Girlguiding.
- Go to team meetings. Attend regular country/regional coordinator meetings and one-to-one
 meetings with the lead volunteer. Share ideas, give updates on country/regional projects and show
 how these meet with the wider Girlguiding and country/region plans.

What training and support do you get?

- We'll give you a thorough induction to your role and to Girlguiding.
- You'll have lots of training opportunities including elearning, face-to-face training and live online classrooms that you can do from home.
- You'll have great ongoing support from the Inspire community, including from other Inspire coordinators and the lead volunteer team, with meetings and events to share information.
- This role is appointed by the chief commissioner for the country or region and coordinators will be members of the country and region team. You'll be expected to regularly meet or update your area, building an effective partnership.
- You'll also be part of Girlguiding's network of country and region coordinators led by a Girlguiding lead volunteer.
- Girlguiding has a clear complaints procedure and support to help sort out problems or disagreements.

Leadership Experience of supporting and leading a group to achieve a goal (for example to complete an activity or project). This could be as a volunteer, at school, college, university or at work
Participation in Girlguiding beyond the unit At district, county or region level, or in an organisational or governance role in another organisation
Knowledge of:
The experiences, preferences and needs of young women aged 18-30*
The aims and vision of Girlguiding Inspire
Girlguiding's vision, values and strategic objectives
