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Activity

How to play

- Sit in a circle, if it's a large group sit in two small circles.
- Hold on to the yarn and throw the ball of yarn to another person in the circle.
- 6 Once everyone has had a turn look at the web the wool has made.

- The earth is home to many different animals, a place where animals live is called a habitat.
- 5 Each person calls out a different animal and where they think it lives creating a web.
- Continue until you have run out of animals and try to throw to different people to create a complex web.

Take turns to throw the ball of wool across the circle and when you catch the ball of wool call out a name of an animal and where you think it lives

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


Rainstick Craft

Rainstick Craft is simple to make!
Rainsticks are ceremonial musical instruments used to invoke the rain spirits. They are made by people who live in the deserts of northern Chile. Rainsticks are traditionally made from dead cactus tubes with hundreds of cactus spines hammered into the tube. Tiny lava pebbles cascade gently through making the sound of rain.

You will need..

- A paper towel tube or other long cardboard tube
- Aluminum foil
- Small dried beans (like lentils), unpopped popcorn, dry rice, or tiny pasta.
- Paper, Glue, Scissors
- Crayons or markers



Step 1: Trace around the end of your tube onto a piece of paper. Draw a bigger circle around that circle and then draw a lot of spokes between the two circles.



Step 5: Crunch the aluminum foil into two long, thin, snake-like shapes. Then twist each one into a spring shape.





Step 2: Cut along the spokes.
Ask a grown up for help if you need it.




Step 6: Put the aluminum foil springs into your tube. Pour some dry beans, dry rice, or un popped popcorn into your tube. The tube should only be about 1/10 full. You can experiment to see how different amounts and different types of seeds and beans change the sound.



Step 3: Put glue on the spokes and glue the cap onto one end of your tube.



Step 7: Make another cap from paper (the same as the first three steps) and cap your tube.



Step 4: Cut a piece of aluminum foil: about one and half times the length of your tube and about 6 inches wide.



Step 7: Make another cap from paper (the same as the first three steps) and cap your tube.

Decorate the tube by making designs with crayons or markers (or cut-out paper or stickers). Rainforest designs are nice, especially brightly coloured butterflies, frogs, and flowers.

Find out about guiding in a country where there is conflict.

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
